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KODIAK COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY ADVISORY ANNOUNCEMENT # 40 **For Emergency Order #4-FS-K-40-26**

There will be a **48-hour extension** to the current commercial salmon fishing period from **6:00 p.m. Saturday, August 22** to **6:00 p.m. Monday, August 24** in the following areas:

- The **Outer Karluk, Outer Ayakulik, Halibut Bay, and Sturgeon Sections of the Southwest Kodiak District;**
- The **Northwest Kodiak District** (except the Anton Larsen Bay, Sharatin Bay, and Kizhuyak Bay Sections remain closed);
- The **Southwest Afognak, Northwest Afognak, and Southeast Afognak Sections of the Afognak District;**
- The **Cape Alitak, Humpy-Deadman, Alitak Bay, Moser Bay, and Olga Bay Sections of the Alitak District;**
- The **Seven Rivers, Two-Headed, and Sitkalidak Sections of the Eastside Kodiak District;** and,
- The **Northeast Kodiak District.**

As Previously Announced:

The following areas remain **open until further notice:**

- The **Duck Bay, Izhut Bay, and Outer Kitoi Bay Sections of the Afognak District.**

Fishermen are reminded that in the **Kodiak Area (including the Mainland District) until further notice, Chinook (king) salmon 28 inches or greater in length may not be retained by purse seine gear** in the commercial fishery and must be returned to the water unharmed.

Other closed waters are as shown on the Kodiak Area Salmon Statistical Chart and detailed in the Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations (5AAC 18.350). Statistical Charts, Harvest Strategies, and Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations are available at the Kodiak Fish and Game office.
