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Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #17

COPPER RIVER DISTRICT: The Copper River District will open at 7:00 am on Thursday, July 9 for a 24-hour commercial drift gillnet fishing period. **Permit holders are advised that unscheduled announcements providing additional fishing opportunity based on Miles Lake sonar passage trends may occur at any time inseason.**

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5 AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing during all periods.

Sockeye salmon abundance trends at the sonar indicate a smaller than forecast run with passage projections through the end of sonar operation suggesting that the inriver goal is likely to be met. Forecast, harvest, sonar apportionment, and fish wheels indicators of Chinook salmon abundance all suggest a weak Copper River Chinook salmon run. Chinook salmon abundance in the commercial fishery peaks during the end of May through early June. Miles Lake Sonar project apportionment data (Figure 1) indicate that the cumulative count of large Chinook salmon is low for the date. The escapement goal was met in 4 out of the last 7 years. The current trend in large Chinook salmon passage indicate that count levels at the end of sonar operation are likely to be around the lower end of the escapement goal.

Cumulative sonar count through 7/7 is 462,245 fish whereas 478,200 fish would be expected by this date based on historical timing applied to the 2026 inriver goal. The 0600 count for 7/8 is 3,666 fish. For the week ending July 4, the actual Copper River Delta survey count was 44,600 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 28,229- 66,722. The cumulative commercial harvest to date is 4,172 Chinook and 228,277 sockeye salmon.

BERING RIVER DISTRICT: Bering River District will open at 7:00 am on Thursday, July 9 for a 24-hour commercial drift gillnet fishing period. For the week ending July 4, the Bering River Delta survey count was 14,175 sockeye salmon versus the anticipated range of 11,015-24,232.

COGHILL DISTRICT: The Coghill District will remain closed due to low WNH chum salmon escapement and low sockeye salmon escapement at Coghill River weir. Through Tuesday, July 7, the Coghill River weir had passed a total of 4,521 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated cumulative total of 10,895 fish. The wild sockeye salmon harvest contribution estimate from the Coghill District period that started on July 2 was 1,500 (49%) for a cumulative total harvest of 5,900 wild fish. PWSAC requests that the Granite Bay and Esther Subdistricts remain closed for the entirety of this commercial fishing period. Cost recovery harvests will continue at WNH as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. An estimated 71,000 fish of the 228,000 broodstock goal have been collected to date. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 24-hour period that started on Monday, July 6 were 5,900 chum and 1,100 sockeye salmon with 71 deliveries reported.

ESHAMY DISTRICT: Per 5 AAC 24.370 (f), the set gillnet fleet is limited to 36 hours per week starting July 10. The Eshamy District will open to commercial **drift gillnet** harvest for a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9. The Eshamy District, excluding waters of the MBH AGZ, will open to commercial **set gillnet** harvest for a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9. The MBH AGZ, excluding waters inside a line of buoys in front of the barrier seine, will open to **DRIFT GILLNET** permit holders only during this fishing period. Regulatory closed waters in the MBH SHA and AGZ, will not be in effect for this fishing period. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Monday, July 6 were 16,200 sockeye and 6,200 chum salmon with 205 deliveries reported.

PWSAC recommends excluding waters inside a line of buoys in front of the barrier seine for this fishing period to facilitate additional brood collection. Fish are being collected behind the barrier seine for brood and 5,429 fish of the 12,000-sockeye salmon goal have been moved into the holding pond.

UNAKWIK DISTRICT: The Unakwik District will open to commercial drift gillnet and purse seine harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9.

SEINE FISHERIES: Aerial surveys of Eastern and Northern districts were conducted on Wednesday, July 6. Fish observations from the survey were minimal. Southeastern District will be flown on Friday. Coghill, Northwestern and Eshamy Districts are scheduled to be flown Saturday, and remaining surveys will occur as weather permits.

Test fishing over the weekend showed very little run entry of VFDA pink salmon into Port Valdez, with set sizes of 50 pinks or less.

MONTAGUE DISTRICT: As previously announced, the Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **north of 60°12.56' N. lat. and east of a line from 60° 12.56'N., 147° 20.25'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147° 14.30'W.**, will open to purse seine fishing for a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9, and a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Saturday, July 11. Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice. The estimated harvest for the 36-hour period ending on July 5 was 8,800 chum salmon with 35 reported deliveries. A total of 840,000 chum salmon is forecast to return to Port Chalmers Subdistrict.

SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT: As previously announced, the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will open to purse seine fishing for a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9, and a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Saturday, July 11. Anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will not be

in effect until further notice. The estimated harvest for the 36-hour period ending on July 5 was 3,900 chum and 285 sockeye salmon with 28 reported deliveries. A total of 330,000 chum salmon is forecast to return to AFK Hatchery. Historical harvest timing for these chum salmon is from June 1 – July 27.

ALL buyers purchasing fish in the PWS Management Area are required to complete a Processor Registration Form. Contact the Cordova office for any questions regarding registration.

The next scheduled salmon fisheries announcement is anticipated to be released by 2:00 pm on Saturday, July 11.

Unless otherwise specified, all openings are clock openings based on Alaska Daylight Time, which is based on Coordinated Universal Time and may be obtained by calling 303-499-7111.

The department encourages commercial permit holders to renew their licenses early and to check their CFEC vessel registration stickers to make sure they are current.

The department also encourages permit holders to report observed violations to Wildlife Safeguard at 800-478-3377. Reports are anonymous and cash rewards may be paid for successful prosecution of violations.
